PROHIBITION ON MAKING OR ACCEPTING POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS IN A COURTHOUSE

Dear Elected Official:

As legal advisor to county elected officials, I wanted to take the opportunity to make you aware of Senate Bill 1152, passed during the 81st Legislative Session, and which will take effect on September 1, 2009 (See attached). This bill changes Section 253.039 of the Texas Election Code by amending subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding subsection (h). Section 253.039 makes it a Class A misdemeanor criminal offense for a person who knowingly makes or authorizes a political contribution while in the courthouse to:

- a candidate or officeholder;
- a political committee; or
- a person acting on behalf of a candidate, officeholder, or political committee.

A person who accepts a political contribution in the courthouse also commits a Class A misdemeanor.

Courthouse is defined as "any building owned by the state, a county, or a municipality, or an office or part of a building leased to the state, a county, or a municipality, in which a justice or judge sits to conduct court proceedings." The change is not limited to the El Paso County Courthouse, but applies to all county annexes, leased and owned Justice of the Peace offices, the Juvenile Probation Department, and the MDR Building.

Please note that the change does not prohibit contributions made in a courthouse via the United States Postal Service or a common or contract carrier.

5	SECTION 1. Section 253.039, Election Code, is amended by

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
