You may qualify for reduced or terminated sentence. MANDATORY JUDICIAL REVIEW

Pursuant to changes in the TCCP, Article 42.12, Section 20(a), which went into effect September 1, 2007, upon completion of one-half of the original community supervision period or two years of community supervision, whichever is more, the judge shall review the probationer's record and consider whether to reduce or terminate the period of community supervision, unless the probationer is delinquent in paying required restitution, fines, costs, or fees and the probationer has the ability to pay or the probationer has not completed court-ordered counseling or treatment.

All eligible cases that have completed one half of the original community supervision period or two years, whichever is more, will be screened by the West Texas Community Supervision and Corrections Department for eligibility for review by the Court.

WHO QUALIFIES?

Article 42.12 TCCP, Section 20(a) applies to **felony** cases, including state jail convictions, probated on or after 09/01/07 and must meet the following criteria:

- Probation fees must be current
- Court cost, fine, restitution and miscellaneous fees must be paid in full
- All court ordered treatment and counseling such as Family Violence Counseling, BIPP, Anger Management, Theft Counseling, TAIP and other treatment and counseling must be completed.

WHO DOES NOT QUALIFY?

- Misdemeanors
- Detainer Cases
- Foreign National Cases
- Absconders
- Deferred Adjudication sentence(s)
- Article 42.12 Section 3(g) offenses
 - o Murder
 - o Capital Murder
 - o Indecency with Child
 - Aggravated Kidnapping
 - o Aggravated Sexual Assault
 - Aggravated Robbery
 - Sexual Assault
- Sections 49.04-49.08 Penal Code (attachment B)
 - Driving While Intoxicated
 - Driving While Intoxicated With Child Passenger
 - Flying While Intoxicated
 - Boating While Intoxicated
 - o Assembling or Operating an Amusement Ride While Intoxicated
 - o Intoxication Assault
 - o Intoxication Manslaughter
 - Offenses for which on conviction registration as a sex offender is required under Chapter 62
