<b>MENTAL HEALTH PEACE OFFICER TRAINING (24 hours) TCLEOSE 4001</b> <i>This is a Mandatory course for all Peace Officer in the Sheriff's Office.</i> The purpose of the Mental Health Officer course is to further inform and educate the officer in the area of mental health and issues pertaining to serving as a mental health officer, to include advanced crisis intervention training. <b>Pre-Requisites:</b> Currently appointed as a peace officer or justice of the peace; at least two years experience as a peace officer or justice of the peace; if not currently a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must meet the current enrollment standards; if an applicant is a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must not ever have had a license or certificate issued by the commission suspended or revoked; if an applicant is a commissioned peace officer, an applicant must have met the continuing education requirements for the previous training cycle; successful completion of a training course in emergency first aid and lifesaving techniques (Red Cross or equivalent); and successful completion of the current Mental Health Officer proficiency, with a score of 80% or better. Never had a license or certificate issued by the commission suspended or revoked. Currently hold a Jailers License and must have Psychological Evaluation cleared by Human Resource. <b>**Minimum Level</b> <b>Limited to 18 students. <b>S.R.T. BUS ASSAULTS (8 hours) TCLEOSE 3500</b> <i>Sheriff's Office SRT Only</i> This course is designed for corrections officers and tactical operators who will be required to board a bus to handle low to high risk situations. Subjects covered include: bus operations, disabling and immobilization methods, boarding evacuation procedures and empty hand vehicle extraction techniques. <b>Requirements:</b> Duty Belt <b>**Medium Level</b> <b>Limited to 15 students Time: 0800-1700</b>	26	-	-
<b>TACTICAL RIFLE FOR THE PATROL OFFICER: (10 hours) TCLEOSE 3342</b> The course will be instructed by the Sheriff's Office SWAT Team; the course will teach the officer to shoot a patrol rifle from supported and unsupported positions, off hand and around barricades and obstructions found in the field. The course will have real world stress fire courses and scenarios. Good Physical Fitness is required; officer will be shooting on the move. <b>Outside agencies must bring own ammo. Pre-Requisite: Must be certified to carry an AR-15/Patrol Rifle &amp; have current qualification prior to attending this course.</b> <b>** MAXIMUM LEVEL Limited to 10 students. <b>BASIC SHOTGUN CERTIFICATION: (24 hours) TCLEOSE # 2055 for El Paso County Sheriff's Office Detention Officer Only.</b> This is a basic certification course. It is required for those persons who will be carrying a shotgun on duty or using a shotgun during the course assignment. This is Not a Re-Certification course or practice. <b>Pre-requisite:</b> Not prohibited by state or federal law or rule from attending training by the commission suspended or revoked. Currently hold a Jailers License and must have Psychological Evaluation cleared by Human Resource. <b>Students are required to bring the shotguns from their respective duty assignments (two shotguns per facility).</b> The Academy will not provide the weapons. <b>Limited to 15 students. <b>PEPPERBALL INSTRUCTOR/ARMORER CERTIFICATION: (16 hours)</b> PepperBall products can help reduce officer and suspect injuries, save lives, decrease the risk of litigation, and improve public perception of law enforcement agencies. <b>BLACKBOARD ON-LINE TRAINING (ORIENTATION): (8 hours credit) for El Paso County Sheriff's Office Personnel ONLY</b> This is a <b>mandatory</b> course for all EPSO personnel. This course is designed as an orientation to the new On-line Blackboard learning system which has replaced the traditional Web based on-line training. The students will cover; E-Training Orientation (2 hrs), Ethics (2 hrs), and Interpersonal Communications-Non Verbal Communication (4 hrs) in the lab through the Blackboard learning system with direct instruction from an instructor. <b>Limited to 22 students. <b>EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION COURSE: (8 hours) TCLEOSE 3027</b> This course was created for individuals that utilized the El Paso County Sheriff's Office frequency as part of their duties. This course will describe the various services provided in public safety, discuss terms associated with Radio Communications, Explains the Officer's roles as it relates to the state emergency response during a disaster, Identify situations requiring organization and consistency in communications, discuss the history and use of TCIC and NCIC, Discuss some Federal Communications Commission Rules & Regulations that govern the operation of communications systems in public safety, Identify and discuss Federal & State Laws governing the operation of the National and State Telecommunications System as they apply to Peace Officer, Demonstrate appropriate use of basic police radio communications, including the use of the phonetic alphabet. <b>Limited to 36 students Time: 0800-1700</b>	-	-	04
<b>NCIC/TCIC LESS THAN FULL ACCESS OPERATORS: (8 hours) TCLEOSE 3807</b> Designed for operators who perform TCIC/NCIC functions at any level lower than full access. Generally, this pertains to inquiry only, including Mobil Digital Terminal (MDT) users. Operators must receive this training within the first six months of assignment or employment. In order to comply with federal requirements, operators must retest within two years of certification or most recent re-certification date. <b>Limited to 36 students. Time: 0800-1700</b>	-	-	11
<b>NCIC/TCIC SPECIFIC FILE TRAINING-PROTECTIVE ORDERS (4 hours) TCLEOSE 3800</b> This course is for telecommunicators and is designed to provide the student with a better understanding of the NCIC/TCIC policy and procedures regarding protective orders. <b>Two Sessions: 0800-1200 &amp; 1300-1700 Limited to 36 students.</b>	-	-	18
<b>FORENSIC CELL PHONE DATA RECOVERY [HIDTA]: (16 hours) TCLEOSE 3200</b> The Primary objectives of this course are to familiarize the law enforcement officer and investigator with different cell phone technologies and teach the practical techniques used in forensic recovery of data stores in cell phones. At the conclusion of this training, each student will be given the opportunity to use all of the listed devices and software in a hands-on environment. <b>Time: 0800-1700 Limited to 60 students. <b>NARCOTIC OFFICER SURVIVAL [HIDTA]: (16 hours) TCLEOSE 2024</b> This course is designed for the planning and execution of safe undercover operations and the tactical planning of a "Dynamic" search warrant service. The first day's topic is "undercover operations" comprised of tapes and discussions. The student will learn how to stop problems before they take place. The second day of the course will provide the narcotics officer with the skills to assist him/her in safely conducting day to day operations. Search warrant situations and officer safety skills will be reviewed and critiqued. Operational deployment and planning will be provided for raid tactics. Team movement and entry training will be provided with role-playing and scenario development. <b>Time: 0800-1700 Limited to 60 students. The identification, investigation, and prosecution of gang related criminal activity will be stressed. This course will cover gang sociology, structures, and history. Black gangs, Hispanic, Asian, and white supremacists will be discussed in depth. The criminal activities of these gangs will be examined with emphasis on drug sales and violence. This course will allow the individual investigator to detect gang activity, identify the membership and have a comprehensive plan to address the threats posed by the organizations. <b>Time: 0800-1700 Limited to 60 students.
