

Early Termination/Discharge

Are you eligible for early termination or discharge?

For Deferred cases

What is deferred adjudication?

Deferred Adjudication is a type of probation that if successfully completed is "dismissed." There is no finding of guilt and Early Termination/Discharge can be requested at anytime during term of supervision.

For Adjudicated cases

What is adjudicated?

For probation purposes, adjudication is the final judgment or conviction. Early Termination/Discharge can be obtained, however the conviction still stands and is not dismissed despite successful completion of conditions or term of supervision.

WHO QUALIFIES?

Anyone who has met the following criteria:

- *Probation fees must be current*
- *Court cost, fine, restitution and miscellaneous fees must be paid in full*
- *All court ordered treatment and counseling such as Family Violence Counseling, BIPP, Anger Management, Theft Counseling, TAIIP and other treatment and counseling must be completed.*

WHO DOES NOT QUALIFY?

- *Sections 49.04-49.08 Penal Code*
 - *Driving While Intoxicated*
 - *Driving While Intoxicated With Child Passenger*
 - *Flying While Intoxicated*
 - *Boating While Intoxicated*
 - *Assembling or Operating an Amusement Ride While Intoxicated*
 - *Intoxication Assault*
 - *Intoxication Manslaughter*
 - *Offenses for which on conviction registration as a sex offender is required under Chapter 62*
