Effective immediately, the Court issues the following Standing Order to ensure transparency, accountability, and the integrity of pleadings filed in this Court:

I. Disclosure Requirement

Any party, attorney, or self-represented litigant who utilizes Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the drafting of any pleading, motion, brief, or other filing submitted to the Court must include a conspicuous statement in the document disclosing such use.

II. Required Attestation

If AI is used in the drafting of any portion of a filed document, the following attestation must be included either at the end of the document or in a separate certificate of service or notice filed concurrently:

AI Disclosure Attestation

I certify that Artificial Intelligence (AI) was used in the preparation of this document. The undersigned has reviewed the content for accuracy, truthfulness, and compliance with applicable rules of procedure and ethics.

III. Responsibility of Filing Party

The filing party remains fully responsible for the contents of the pleading, including ensuring that any information generated by AI is accurate, complete, and complies with all legal and ethical obligations under the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure and the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

IV. Failure to Comply

Failure to include the required attestation may result in the document being stricken, sanctions, or other remedies as the Court deems appropriate.
