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# 1.1 – Introduction

The purpose of this document is to solicit proposals for a Video News Releases Provider, which will be used to prepare and release video news to the media pertaining the developments and activities of the Border Children's Mental Health Collaborative (BCMHC).

The Border Children's Mental Health Collaborative is a community-based system of care development effort for youth with serious emotional disturbances (SED) in El Paso County, Texas.

The BCMHC represents an effort among all the community's state and local child serving agencies to stop the tragic and wasteful removal of our children and adolescents, who have SED, to residential treatment centers that are often 500 - 600 miles from their homes and community.

Funded by SAMSHA (Department of Health and Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration), through a six – year grant, the BCMHC is a County supported organization created to operate an integrated system of care for all El Paso County youth with SED; to promote the system integration through a governance team who provides policy leadership and includes family and professional representatives of all the community's major child-serving systems as well as courts that oversee the child welfare, juvenile justice, and mental health systems.

The team also promotes the use of the wraparound process with individual youth and family teams to provide case management services for all youth who are served by the BCMHC, regardless of referral or payment source.

## 1.2 – RFP Schedule

### 1.4 – Vendor Qualifications

EPC will evaluate proposals only from vendors that meet the following qualifications:

- Vendor must be an established reputable media company with a good track record of at least two years.
- Vendor must have a verifiable positive report with local media channels (TV, Newspapers, and radio) of at least two years

### 1.5 - Non-Responsive Proposals

Any proposal that does not directly address the needs of El Paso County as described in the RFP will be considered non-responsive and will not be considered. A proposal that does not prove the vendor's ability to furnish a suitable solution, based on experience and references, as well as response to the design and planning requirements in the RFP, will not be considered.

#### 1.6 – Contract / Agreement

The vendor is required to submit two originals of the vendor's proposed solution, design, terms and conditions for this project. These agreements must be included in the RFP response package. It is anticipated, and the County reserves the right to do so, that the final contract will be negotiated with the Vendor

#### 1.7 – Submittal Information

Vendors must submit one (1) original and eight (8) copies of their proposals; all materials submitted in response to this RFP would become the property of El Paso County. Vendors will be aware that El Paso County is a public entity and as such, must abide by the public record laws. Proposals will be kept confidential until the selection process has been completed. At that time, the contents of the proposals become public record and open to inspection by all parties.

The vendor is responsible for all costs incurred in preparing and submitting the vendor's response to the RFP. All costs incurred for the presentation and demonstration of the vendor's recommendation is the responsibility of the vendor.

#### 1.8 - Cost / Price Certification

All costs and prices proposed in the response to this RFP must be valid for a minimum of 120 days. El Paso County is not responsible for any vendor errors, omissions or miscalculations

# 1.9 – Acceptance and Use of Proposal

El Paso County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals. The County reserves the right to use any or all nonproprietary ideas, concepts, or configurations presented in vendors' responses.

2.1 – Questions and Clarifications

All questions must be submitted in written form. Answers will be forwarded to vendors indicating a desire to respond. No other source or process is authorized for this RFQ.

#### 2.2 - Specifications

El Paso County is requesting written proposals from qualified vendors, to provide Video News Releases that will comply with the BCMHC's requirements, which include:

- 1. Provider must establish proven experience in local broadcast news
- 2. Understands how to write and shoot for news style stories, VO/Sots and PKGS.
- 3. Shooting and editing news stories with quality of their shooting and editing been up to par with any news broadcasting station in El Paso, Tx in order to be seamless across different major news broadcasting companies nationwide
- 4. Still photography capability in order to provide photos to print media in different formats as required.
- 5. Experienced in news writing. Company will need to be able to provide news scripts to newspapers and to all local TV and Radio Stations in a written style that is comparable to current El Paso Media News Writing.
- 6. Provide bilingual scripts in order to provide solid news scripts to both English and Spanish broadcast and printed media.
- 7. Capability to dub in multiple formats, including but not limited to: DVD, QuickTime, Beta, DVC Pro, depending on station requirements.
- 8. Have enough flexibility to be able to respond to a shoot or story within 24 hour notice.
- 9. Must be able to turnaround a story for broadcast or print within 24 hours, unless the story is breaking, in which case it must be turned for appropriate station and print deadlines as necessary.

#### 2.3 – Response Format

Vendor responses to the RFQ must follow the forms and format provided in the RFQ. Additional information can certainly be provided but not in lieu of the prescribed format. It is intended that the technical and application data be presented separate from the cost data and that the cost data contain no technical data. #### 2.4 - Vendor References

Proposals must include references that have used the services provided by the vendor.

- The references are mandatory.
- The references must clearly establish that the proposed services are in production usage.
- EPC is interested in only using a vendor with current experience with video news releases to local broadcasting media.
- The references must demonstrate a positive relationship for at least two years with local broadcasting media.
- The references must clearly demonstrate that the proposed services are relevant to this project in all aspects.

### 2.5 - Vendor Presentations and Demonstrations

Vendors will be required to present and demonstrate their video news release capabilities as well as previous/current work in this field to the evaluation committee. Vendors must be prepared to conduct this activity with limited notice. Presentation and demonstration are to be conducted at the County of El Paso, Texas at a date to be determined by the evaluation committee.

# Section 3 – Costs

# 3.1 – Total Costs

The vendor must provide:

- Total and detailed costs of the proposed project.
- Cost must show a rate and a breakdown of estimated length of time required to prepare 30 and 60 second spots to be released to TV news broadcasting channels.
- These costs will be summarized and presented on one page.

## 4.1 – Evaluation Criteria

All responses received in compliance with the terms and conditions of the El Paso County Purchasing Department will be submitted to the Border Children's Mental Health Collaborative (BCMHC). The responses will be reviewed and evaluated by an evaluation committee selected by BCMHC.

- Vendors will be required to demonstrate or otherwise validate the effectiveness of proposed designs and plans.
- Recommendations from the BCMHC evaluation committee will be presented to the Commissioners' Court for award.

Instructions for the certifications:

#### General Requirements

The County of El Paso, Texas is required to obtain from all applicants of federal funds or passthrough certifications regarding federal debt status, debarment and suspension, and a drug free workplace. Institutional applicants are required to certify that they will comply with the nondiscrimination statutes and implementing regulations.

(c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award document for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-grants, contracts under grants and cooperative agreements, and subcontracts) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

### 1. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS

As required by Executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension and implemented at 21 CFR Part 1404, for prospective participants in primary covered transactions

A. The applicant certifies that it and its principals:

(a) Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, sentenced to a denial of Federal benefits by a State or Federal court, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;

2. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE

As required by the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1988, and implemented at 21 CFR Part 1404 Subpart F.

A. The applicant certifies that it will or will continue to provide a drug free workplace by:

(a). Publishing a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the applicant's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition;

- (2) Notify the employer in writing of his or her conviction for a violation of a criminal drug statute occurring in the workplace no later than five calendar days after such conviction.

(e) Notifying the agency, in writing, within 10 calendar days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2) from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such convictions. Employers of convicted employees must provide notice including position title, to: The County of El Paso, Texas, 500 East San Antonio Street, Suite 406, El Paso, Texas 79901. Notice shall include the identification number of each affected grant

(f) Taking one of the following actions within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee who is so convicted:

(1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or

(2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency

(g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).

3. CERTIFICATION REGARDING FEDERAL DEBT STATUS (OMB Circular A-129)

The Applicant certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it is not delinquent in the repayment of any federal debt.

U.S.C. 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance; (c) title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972m as amended (20 U.S.C. 1981 et seq.) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance; and (d) the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and amended (42 U.S.C. 6101 ec seq.) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of age in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance, except that actions which reasonably take age into account as a factor necessary for the normal operation or achievement of any statutory objective of the project or activity shall not violate this statute.

#### Tex. Local Gov't Code § 176.006 (2005)

§ 176.006. Disclosure Requirements for Vendors and Other Persons; Questionnaire

(a) A person described by Section 176.002(a) shall file a completed conflict of interest questionnaire with the appropriate records administrator not later than the seventh business day after the date that the person:

(1) begins contract discussions or negotiations with the local governmental entity; or

(2) submits to the local governmental entity an application, response to a request for proposals or bids, correspondence, or another writing related to a potential agreement with the local governmental entity.

(b) The commission shall adopt a conflict of interest questionnaire for use under this section that requires disclosure of a person's affiliations or business relationships that might cause a conflict of interest with a local governmental entity.

(c) The questionnaire adopted under Subsection (b) must require, for the local governmental entity with respect to which the questionnaire is filed, that the person filing the questionnaire:

(1) describe each affiliation or business relationship the person has with each local government officer of the local governmental entity;

(2) identify each affiliation or business relationship described by Subdivision (1) with respect to which the local government officer receives, or is likely to receive, taxable income from the person filing the questionnaire;

(3) identify each affiliation or business relationship described by Subdivision (1) with respect to which the person filing the questionnaire receives, or is likely to receive, taxable income that:

(A) is received from, or at the direction of, a local government officer of the local governmental entity; and

(B) is not received from the local governmental entity;

(4) describe each affiliation or business relationship with a corporation or other business entity with respect to which a local government officer of the local governmental entity:

(A) serves as an officer or director; or

(B) holds an ownership interest of 10 percent or more;

(5) describe each affiliation or business relationship with an employee or contractor of the local governmental entity who makes recommendations to a local government officer of the local governmental entity with respect to the expenditure of money;

(6) describe each affiliation or business relationship with a person who:

(A) is a local government officer; and

(B) appoints or employs a local government officer of the local governmental entity that is the subject of the questionnaire; and

(7) describe any other affiliation or business relationship that might cause a conflict of interest.

(d) A person described by Subsection (a) shall file an updated completed questionnaire with the appropriate records administrator not later than:

(1) September 1 of each year in which an activity described by Subsection (a) is pending; and

(2) the seventh business day after the date of an event that would make a statement in the questionnaire incomplete or inaccurate.

(e) A person is not required to file an updated completed questionnaire under Subsection (d)(1) in a year if the person has filed a questionnaire under Subsection (c) or (d)(2) on or after June 1, but before September 1, of that year.

(f) A person commits an offense if the person violates this section. An offense under this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor.

(g) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (f) that the person filed the required questionnaire not later than the seventh business day after the date the person received notice of the violation.

#### Tex. Local Gov't Code § 176.001 (2005)

§ 176.001. Definitions

In this chapter:

(1) "Commission" means the Texas Ethics Commission.

(2) "Family member" means a person related to another person within the first degree by consanguinity or affinity, as described by Subchapter B, Chapter 573, Government Code.

(3) "Local governmental entity" means a county, municipality, school district, junior college district, or other political subdivision of this state or a local government corporation, board, commission, district, or authority to which a member is appointed by the commissioners court of a county, the mayor of a municipality, or the governing body of a municipality. The term does not include an association, corporation, or organization of governmental entities organized to provide to its members education, assistance, products, or services or to represent its members before the legislative, administrative, or judicial branches of the state or federal government.

(4) "Local government officer" means:

(A) a member of the governing body of a local governmental entity; or

(B) a director, superintendent, administrator, president, or other person designated as the executive officer of the local governmental entity.

(5) "Records administrator" means the director, county clerk, municipal secretary, superintendent, or other person responsible for maintaining the records of the local governmental entity.
