(This form must be signed by an officer, principal, or individual authorized to bind the company under a contract with the County.)

IN COMPLIANCE WITH CHAPTER 161 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, ANY VENDOR INVOLVED IN A SINGLE PROCUREMENT EXCEEDING \$50,000 MUST COMPLETE THE ENCLOSED ETHICS TRAINING BEFORE SUBMITTING A BID OR PROPOSAL WITH THE COUNTY OF EL PASO.

Purpose: The stability of democracy depends upon the continuing consent of the governed, which in turn depends upon the trust the electorate holds for its government. The Ethics Commission of the County of El Paso, Texas, in concert with elected county officials, as well as leaders of the various county departments, recognizes the need to maintain the public trust and confidence in the workings of county government and thus adopts this Code of Ethics.

What is a vendor:

Any person or their representative or employee whose goods and services are purchased under the terms of a purchase order or contractual agreement with the county; and any other persons doing business with the County.

Procurement: In advising upon, discussing, recommending, and/or granting any County purchases, bids or contracts, County public servants shall inform themselves about their financial interests, and shall make a reasonable effort to inform themselves about the financial interest of their family members.

County public servants shall excuse themselves from exercising influence, participating in, discussing, recommending, and/or granting of any County purchases, bids, or contracts if they or a family member have a substantial financial interest.

Private Communication: No member of the El Paso County Commissioners Court, County Elected Officials/Department Heads or the El Paso County Hospital District Board of Managers shall permit any vendor, its lobbyists, representative, or employee to communicate with him privately regarding any procurement of items by the County or the Hospital District from the date that the bid, RFP, or RFQ is authorized or released, whichever is first. No private communication regarding the purchase shall be permitted by a member of the Commissioners Court, a county elected official/department head, or

the hospital district board of managers until the procurement process is complete and a purchase order is granted or a contract is entered into.

Members of the Commissioners Court, county elected officials/department heads and the board of managers shall make a reasonable effort to inform themselves regarding procurements and shall have a duty to inquire of vendors, their lobbyists, representatives, or employees, the nature of the private communication being sought prior to engaging in any communication.

This prohibition against private communication with vendors, their lobbyists, representatives, or employees shall apply to commissioners court approval of hospital district purchases.

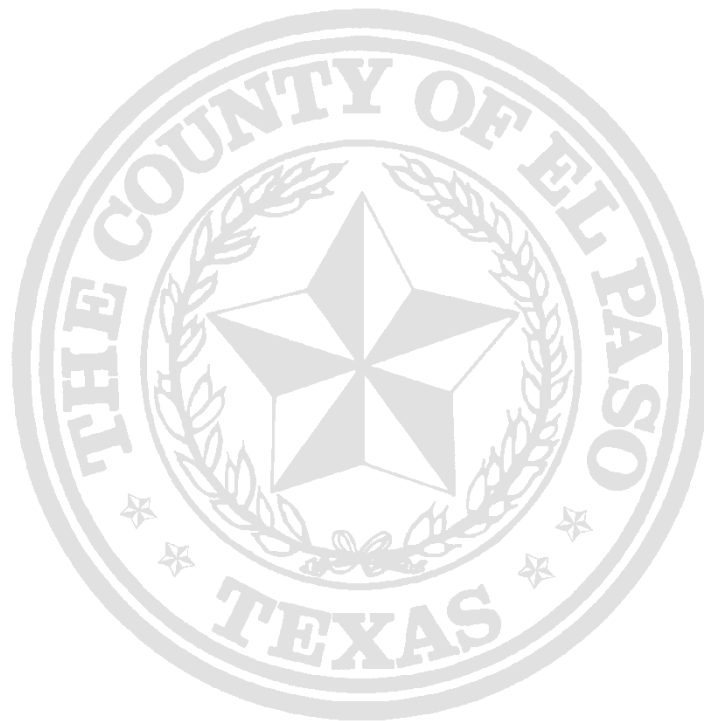

INTRODUCTION

The County of El Paso, Texas "County" is seeking qualifications for environmental engineering firms licensed to practice in the State of Texas to assist the County on an as-needed basis for environmental projects. The County seeks to award a contract to one or more companies for the period of two (2) years, with the option to renew the contract for two (2) additional years. The following outlines this request for qualifications.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The consultant shall submit a proposed scope of work and determine the extent of environmental services required per individual projects arising from this contract. The consultant shall meet with the El Paso County Public Works Department to coordinate the project requirements and determine the appropriate consultants required to perform the tasks associated with the individual projects. The consultant shall be responsible to prepare the following:

1. The consultant will prepare a scope of work based on the needs of the individual project. The consultant shall meet with the Public Works Department to coordinate the extent of services required and shall prepare a scope of work, projection schedule or tasks and anticipated specialized consultant list and subsequently a projected budget and associated fees.
2. The consultant shall analyze scope of work so that all work must comply with all applicable local, county, state and federal codes, laws, regulations and guidelines, including but not limited to Texas Commissioner on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations.
3. The consultant shall provide services that consistent with professional.
4. Environmental Engineering Consultant Services contract which may include, but are not limited to the following types of services. This scope of services is intended to represent the type of projects that may arise during the term of the contract. The consultant may supplement their in-house capabilities through teaming arrangements with other firms.
 - A. Petroleum Storage Tank (PST) and Leaking Petroleum Storage Tank (LPST) Sites.

Consultant may be required to conduct the removal or abandonment of PST facilities on county properties in accordance with TCEQ requirements; therefore consultant may be required to obtain the services of a Registered Underground Storage Tank (UST) Contractor. The consultant may be required to conduct all phases of assessment or corrective action at LPST sites and shall maintain

registration as a LPST corrective Action Specialist (CAS) as well as provide a registered LPST Corrective Action Project Manager (CAPM) in accordance with Title 30, Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 334, Subchapter J. LPST assessments may require the drilling and installation of monitoring wells by a licensed environmental driller and the collection of soil and ground water samples for analysis by an analytical laboratory. Consultant shall have a minimum of two (2) years of experience providing PST and LPST services as describe above.

B. Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments (ESAs)

Phase I ESA shall be conducted in accordance with ASTM E1527-05, Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process. Consultant shall provide qualified environmental professional to perform and/or oversee the preparation of all Phase I or Phase II ESAs and shall demonstrate experience assessing a variety of property and industry types. Consultant shall have a minimum of three (3) years experience conducting Phase I and Phase II ESAs.

C. Asbestos

The Consultant must have the appropriate knowledge and understanding of Federal and State regulations governing the management of regulated asbestos containing materials (RACM). The consultant may be required to perform asbestos surveys, prepare abatement project specifications, and oversee abatement activities. The Consultant shall provide a Licensed Asbestos Consultant Agency and a Licensed Asbestos Individual consultant to perform or oversee the services. The Consultant shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience conducting asbestos related services.

D. Mold

The Consultant must have the appropriate knowledge and understanding of Federal and State regulations governing the management of mold assessment and remediation. The Consultant shall provide an individual Licensed Mold Assessment Consultant to perform all mold assessment and remediation management activities. The Consultant shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience managing mold assessment and abatement activities.

E. Lead-Based Paint

The Consultant must have the appropriate knowledge and understanding of Federal and State regulations governing the management of lead-based paint. The Consultant may be required to perform lead-based paint assessments and

manage abatement activities and shall have a minimum of two (2) years of experience in this field.

F. National Environmental Policy Act Documentation

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documentation is typically required for projects that involve federal funding, such as projects involving certain roadway and bridge projects. Consultant may be required to prepare environmental assessments, environmental impact statements, or other NEPA documentation for these types of projects. Consultant shall have a range of staff capable of performing biological surveys, archaeological surveys, and other environmental assessment activities required during the preparation of the NEPA documentation. Consultant shall have a minimum of four (4) years experience preparing NEPA documentation and shall have successfully completed a number of NEPA projects.

G. Archaeological Investigations

The Consultant must have the appropriate knowledge and expertise to perform archaeological investigations including records research, field reconnaissance, pedestrian surveys, National Register Testing, other assessment, and mitigation. In addition, the work may include providing an Archaeological Monitor to be present on-site during construction activities to monitor excavations to determine archaeological significance. All activities shall comply with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and with the Texas Historical Commission requirements.

H. Hazardous Waste Management

The Consultant must have a good knowledge of the Federal (40 CFR, Chapter I, Parts 265 to 299) and State (30 TAC Chapter 335) environmental regulations governing the management of industrial solid waste and county-generated hazardous waste. The Consultant may be required to provide the following types of hazardous waste management services:

- Prepare annual waste reports.
- Provide training to County personnel regarding hazardous waste management.
- Assist the County in the classification and proper disposal of hazardous waste.

Consultant shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience related to hazardous waste services.

I. Storm Water Management

The Consultant may be required to prepare or update industrial storm water pollution prevention plans (SWP3) for the County in accordance with Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) General Permit for industrial discharges. The Consultant may be required to design and implement best management practices for improving storm water quality. The consultant may also conduct storm water monitoring, training, and inspections of County facilities in relation to an industrial SWP3. Consultant shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience with Storm Water Management practices.

J. General Environmental Service

The Consultant may be required to provide a range of environmental services that are not describe in the above categories. These services may include, but are not limited to:

- Provide environmental training to County personnel, including 40-hour OSHA Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) training and 8-hour HAZWOPER refresher and awareness training.
- Prepare Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure (SPCC) Plans for the County.
- Prepare the annual Tier II Chemical Inventory report for County facilities.
- Assist the County in the management of spill clean-up activities in accordance with TCEQ requirements.
- Assist the County with GIS mapping and updating GIS databases related to environmental features or programs.
- Assist the County with implementing and maintaining an Environmental Management System (EMS) for environmental compliance management at County facilities.
- Provide strategic planning and feasibility study services.

K. Analytical Laboratory Services

The County expects that analytical laboratory services will be required for this contract to perform analytical testing in support of the above mentioned environmental services. The laboratories should maintain accreditation by an

approved, independent accrediting organization, e.g., American Association of Laboratory Accreditation (A2LA) and/or demonstrate successful participation in appropriate proficiency analytical testing programs for the testing that they will perform under this contract, and/or be in good standing with TCEQ and EPA, as necessary.

Upon being notified of each project, Consultants must provide copies of all applicable licenses or registrations for the firm and firm's project personnel which may include:

1. Registered Professional Engineer
2. Registered Professional Geologist
3. Individual Asbestos Consultant
4. Asbestos Consultant Agency
5. Corrective Action Project Manager
6. Corrective Action Specialist
7. Licensed Mold Assessment Consultant

American Association for Laboratory Accreditation (A2LA) or other acceptable laboratory accreditation.

The consultant shall prepare and submit monthly status reports on projects progress and update the Public Works Department on scope and schedule status.

The consultant shall prepare and provide all documentation associated with the project's requirements.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATION

The consultant Firm shall have been in business for no less than three (3) years.

Proposed Firm staff shall be licensed to perform work in the State of Texas. Include copies of the current licenses.

Proposal must demonstrate sufficient experience in environmental engineering as related to the Scope of Work.

QUALIFICATION SUBMISSION

The qualifications must be submitted in sealed envelopes on or before the deadline. **One original signature copy and six (6) electronic copies on CD/DVD/flash drive. Qualification package shall not exceed twenty (20) pages, not including resumes.**

To be deemed responsive, submittals must at a minimum contain the following:

- Cover letter (one page).
- Technical Competence and Experience (two pages)
- Team Organization and Availability (one page)
- Project Management and Quality Control (two pages)

Brief resumes for Key Project Personnel may be submitted at the option of the consultant. Such resumes shall be attached to the Team Organization and Availability section and **shall not exceed two (2) pages each**. Resumes will **not** be included in the twenty (20) page count described above. Graphic, Schematic, Photos, and Tables shall be kept to a minimum, inserted within the twenty (20) page count above if space permits, and used only to augment any of the required information more clearly. No cost information is to be provided.

Individuals or firms may be invited to make presentations in person to the County review committee at a time and place designated by the committee. No communication shall be made with persons assigned to the review committee by individuals or firms responding to this solicitation other than as requested by the committee as a whole. All communication must be through the Purchasing Agent or her designee.

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

The Qualifications received will be evaluated and ranked according to the following criteria:

Response to Scope of Work (40 Points) – Provide your understanding of the Scope of Work described in this RFQ. Briefly outline any similar projects or related experience in the past five (5) years. Provide agency name, address, contact name, e-mail or phone number of the references provided. A complete history of projects and contacts shall **not** be provided. Information provided shall consist of a minimum of three (3) and not more than five (5) similar projects. The County will evaluate the preparedness, enthusiasm, and capacity of the proposer to understand and deal with the requirements of the project. The consulting firm shall **not** reiterate the tasks outlined in the Scope of Work, except to summarize or reinforce its understanding of the Scope for this project.

Background and Experience of Proposed Staff (50 Points) – Provide history of company and experience of staff. Provide a brief discussion of the process and procedures in place and proposed for managing environmental projects. Indicate what the key ingredients are for a successful project and what methods and organizational efforts are made to ensure quality control in projects. In addition, a firm's evaluation will be based on its track record of successful projects, relative to scheduling, reporting, cost-control, quality of deliverables, timely responses, and the ability to provide experienced quality control personnel and procedures. Please provide work experience by the key personnel and resumes.

Capacity to Perform- (10 Points) - Provide a hierarchal Organizational Chart indicating the Project Team which includes names of the proposed key project personnel, their area of responsibility, and relationships of sub consultants. The proposed Firm Project Manager to be assigned to the County is to be designated and shall appear in the organizational chart. Provide Table of Availability of key personnel.

EVALUATION:

The County evaluation committee will recommend the most highly qualified firm(s) and will recommend award to County Commissioners Court and authorization for the Purchasing Agent to negotiate a contract as each project arises at a fair and reasonable price. If a satisfactory contract cannot be negotiated, the County will formally end negotiations with that Firm and select the next most highly qualified Firm and attempt to negotiate a contract with that Firm at a fair and reasonable price. The County shall continue the process so described until a contract is entered into.

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION:

Qualifications shall be received no later **than 2:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time on Monday, March 30, 2015** at the County of El Paso, Purchasing Department, 800 E. Overland, Suite 300, El Paso, TX 79901.

**General Provisions
County of El Paso, Texas**

These General Provisions are considered standard language for all County of El Paso bids and RFP documents. If any “specific bid requirements” differ from the General Provisions listed here, the “specific bid requirements” shall prevail.

1. PROPOSAL PACKAGE

- a. The request for proposal, general and special provisions, drawings, specifications/line item details, contract documents and the proposal sheet are all considered part of the proposal package. Proposals must be submitted on the forms provided by the County, including the proposal sheet completed in its entirety and signed by an authorized representative by original signature. Failure to complete and sign the proposal sheet/contract page (s) may disqualify the proposal from being considered by Commissioners’ Court. Any individual signing on behalf of the proposer expressly affirms that he or she is duly authorized to tender this proposal and to sign the proposal sheet/contract under the terms and conditions in this proposal. Proposer further understands that the signing of the contract shall be of no effect unless subsequently awarded and the contract properly executed by Commissioners’ Court. All figures must be written in ink or typed. Figures written in pencil or with erasures are not acceptable. However, mistakes may be crossed out, corrections inserted, and initialed in ink by the individual signing the proposal. Changes must also be made to any electronic copies submitted. If there are discrepancies between unit prices quoted and extensions, the unit price will prevail. Each proposer is required to thoroughly review this entire proposal packet to familiarize themselves with the proposal procedures, the plans and specifications for the requested work as well as the terms, and conditions of the contract the successful proposer will execute with the County.
- b. Proposal must be in the Purchasing Department BEFORE the hour and date specified. Faxed or e-mailed proposals will not be accepted. Late proposals will not be considered under any circumstances.**
- c. Any proposal sent via express mail or overnight delivery must have the RFP number and title clearly marked on the outside of the envelope or package. Failure to clearly identify your proposal may be cause for disqualification.

2. COMPETITIVENESS AND INTEGRITY

To prevent biased evaluations and to preserve the competitiveness and integrity of such acquisition efforts, proposers are to direct all communications regarding this proposal to the El Paso County Purchasing Agent or assigned designee, unless otherwise specifically noted.

An authorized person from the submitting firm must sign all proposals. The signature acknowledges that the proposer has read the proposal documents thoroughly before submitting a proposal and will fulfill the obligations in accordance to the terms, conditions, and specifications.

Please carefully review this Request for Proposal. It provides specific information necessary to aid participating firms in formulating a thorough response.

3. PROPOSER'S RESPONSIBILITY

The Proposer must affirmatively demonstrate its responsibility. The Proposer must also meet the following minimum requirements:

- Have been in business of providing services for a minimum of 5 years;
- Have adequate financial resources or the ability to obtain such resources as required;
- Be able to comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, ordinances and orders regarding this Request for Proposal;
- Have satisfactory record of performance;
- Have a satisfactory record of integrity and ethics; and
- Be otherwise qualified and eligible to receive an award.

4. REJECTION OF PROPOSALS

The County, acting through its Commissioners' Court reserves the right to: (1) reject any and all proposals and waive any informality in the proposals received; (2) disregard the proposal of any proposer determined to be not responsible. The County further reserves the right to reject any proposal due to failure of performance on deliveries as determined in writing by the County Purchasing Agent.

5. RESTRICTIVE OR AMBIGUOUS SPECIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the prospective proposer to review the entire invitation to proposal packet and to notify the Purchasing Department if the specifications are formulated in a manner that would restrict competition or appear ambiguous. Any such protest or question(s) regarding the specifications or proposal procedures must be received in the Purchasing Department no less than seventy-two hours prior to the time set for proposal opening. Vendors are to propose as specified herein or propose an approved equal. The mention of any brand name in the specifications is not intended to be restrictive, but is intended to describe the general features and requirements (or equivalent) that the County of El Paso is seeking.

Under Local Gov't Code Section 262.005 and Health & Safety Code Section 361.426, the County is required to give preference to products made of recycled materials if they meet specs. The County is also required to encourage the use of recycled products in developing new procedures and specs. They are also required to eliminate procedures and specifications that explicitly discriminate against products made of recycled materials.

6. SUBSTITUTES

It is not the County's intent to discriminate against any material of equal merit to those specified however, should the proposer desire to use any substitutions, prior written approval shall be obtained from the County Purchasing Agent sufficiently in advance in order that an addendum might be issued.

7. EXCEPTIONS TO PROPOSAL

The proposer will list on a separate sheet of paper any exceptions to the conditions of the proposal. This sheet will be labeled, "Exceptions to Proposal Conditions", and will be

attached to the proposal. If no exceptions are stated, it will be understood that all general and specific conditions will be complied with, without exception.

The Proposer must specify in its proposal any alternatives it wishes to propose for consideration by the County. Each alternative should be sufficiently described and labeled within the proposal and should indicate its possible or actual advantage to the program being offered.

The County reserved the right to offer these alternatives to other proposers.

8. TAX EXEMPTION

Pursuant to Section 151.309 of the Texas Tax Code, El Paso County qualifies for exemption from sales, excise and use taxes imposed under the Limited Sales, Excise, and Use Tax Act, which is codified at Chapter 151 of the Texas Tax Code. In accordance with Section 151.309, a taxable item sold, leased, or rented to, or stored, used, or consumed by the County is exempt from the taxes imposed under Chapter 151.

9. MODIFICATION OF PROPOSALS

A proposer may modify a proposal by letter at any time prior to the submission deadline for receipt of proposals. Modification requests must be received prior to the submission deadline. Modifications made before opening time must be initialed by proposer guaranteeing authenticity. Proposals may not be amended or altered after the official opening with the single exception that any product literature and/or supporting data required by the actual specifications, if any, will be accepted at any time prior to the Commissioners' Court consideration of same. No substitutions or cancellations for merchandise will be permitted without written approval of the County Purchasing Agent.

10. SIGNATURE OF PROPOSALS

Each proposal shall give the complete mailing address of the Proposer and be signed by an authorized representative by original signature with the authorized representative's name and legal title typed below the signature line. Each proposal shall include the Proposer's Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN), Failure to sign the Contract page(s) and proposal response sheet will disqualify the proposal from being considered by the County. The person signing on behalf of the Proposer expressly affirms that the person is duly authorized to render the proposal and to sign the proposal sheets and contract under the terms and conditions of this RFP and to bind the Proposer thereto and further understands that the signing of the contract shall be of no effect until it is properly placed on the Commissioner's Court agenda, approved in open Court, authorized to be executed by the County Judge, and fully executed by both parties.

11. AWARD OF BID/PROPOSALS-EVALUTATION CRITERIA AND FACTORS

Pursuant to the Texas Local Government Code

Bids shall be awarded to the responsible bidder that submits the lowest and best bid.

Proposals will be made to the responsible proposer whose proposal is determined to be the best evaluated offer demonstrating the best ability to fulfill the requirements set forth in this Request for Proposal. The prices proposed will be considered firm and cannot be altered after the submission deadline. **The proposed cost to the County will be**

considered firm, unless the County invokes its right to request a best and final offer and cannot be altered after the submission deadline.

The County reserves the right to reject any or all proposals in whole or in part received by reason of this RFP and may discontinue its efforts under this RFP for any reason or no reason or solely for the County's convenience at any time prior to actual execution of the contract by the County. County reserves the right to accept or reject all or any part of the proposal, waive minor technicalities, or to award by item or by total proposal. Price should be itemized.

A Proposer whose proposal does not meet the mandatory requirements set forth in this RFP will be considered noncompliant.

Each Proposer, by submitting a proposal, agrees that if its proposal is accepted by the Commissioners' Court, such Proposer will furnish all items and services upon the terms and conditions in this RFP and contract.

Contractor shall submit to the County, for approval, within ten (10) days from notice of contract award, all Certificates of Insurance evidencing the required coverage as described under Insurance in the schedule of the Requests for Proposals.

12. PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT

The parties agree that the County is a governmental body for purposes of the Public Information Act, codified as Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code and as such is required to release information in accordance with the Public Information Act. Proposer agrees that it has marked any information that it considers to be confidential, proprietary, and/or trade secret in its bid. County agrees to provide notice to Proposer in accordance with the Public Information Act in the event the County receives a request for information under the Public Information Act for information that the Proposer has marked as confidential, proprietary, and/or trade secret.

13. RESULTANT CONTRACT

The resultant contract shall become effective upon the Commissioners' Court execution of the same. The contract documents shall consist of the contract, the general and special provisions, the drawings, proposal package, any addenda issued, and any change orders issued during the work.

The criteria utilized for determining responsibility of proposer(s) includes, but is not limited to, the proposer's experience, skill, ability, business judgment, financial capacity, integrity, honesty, possession of the necessary facilities or equipment, previous performance, reputation, promptness, and any other factor deemed relevant by the County to determine whether a proposer is responsible. The term of the resultant contract will begin as stated in the contract executed by the Commissioners' Court and will terminate on the date specified in the contract unless terminated earlier as herein set forth.

14. ESTIMATED QUANTITIES

Any reference to quantities shown in the Request for Proposals are an estimate only. Since the exact quantities cannot be predetermined, the County reserves the right to adjust quantities as deemed necessary to meet its requirements.

15. CONTRACTOR INVESTIGATION

Before submitting a proposal, each contractor shall make all investigations and examinations necessary to ascertain all site conditions and requirements affecting the full performance of the contract and to verify any representations made by the County upon which the contractor will rely. If the contractor receives an award as a result of its proposal submission, failure to have made such investigations and examinations will in no way relive the contractor from its obligation to comply in every detail with all provisions and requirements of the contract, nor will a plea of ignorance of such conditions and requirements be accepted as a basis for any claim whatsoever by the contractor for additional compensation.

16. NO COMMITMENT BY COUNTY

This Request for Proposal does not commit the County to award any costs or pay any costs, or to award any contract, or to pay any costs associated with or incurred in the preparation of a proposal to this request, or to procure or contract for services or supplies.

17. BEST AND FINAL OFFERS

In acceptance of proposals, the County reserves the right to negotiate further with one or more of the contractors as to any features of their proposals and to accept modifications of the work and price when such action will be in the best interest of the County. This includes solicitations of a Best and Final Offer from one or more of the proposers. If invoked, it allows acceptable proposers the opportunity to amend, change or supplement their original proposal. Proposers may be contacted in writing requesting that they submit their best and final offer. Any such best and final offer must include discussed and negotiated changes.

18. SINGLE PROPOSAL RESPONSE

If only one proposal is received in response to the Request for Proposals, a detailed cost proposal may be requested of the single contractor. A cost/price analysis and evaluation and/or audit may be performed of the cost proposal in order to determine if the price is fair and reasonable.

19. REJECTION/DISQUALIFICATION OF PROPOSALS

El Paso County reserves the right to reject any or all proposals in whole or in part received by reason of this proposal package and may discontinue its efforts for any reason under this proposal package at any time prior to actual execution of the Contract by the County. Proposers may be disqualified and rejection of proposals may be recommended to the Commissioners' Court for any of (but not limited to) the following causes:

- A. Failure to use the proposal form(s) furnished by the County, if applicable.
- B. Lack of signature by an authorized representative that can legally bind the company on the proposal form.
- C. Failure to properly complete the proposal.
- D. Proposals that do not meet the mandatory requirements.
- E. Evidence of collusion among proposers.

20. CHANGES IN SPECIFICATIONS

If it becomes necessary to revise any part of this proposal, a written notice of such revision will be posted on the County Purchasing website. The County is not bound by any oral representations, clarifications, or changes made in the written specifications by the County's employees, unless such clarification or change is posted on the County Purchasing website. It shall be the Proposer's responsibility to check the website prior to the bid opening date to verify whether any addendums have been posted.

21. PROPOSAL IDEAS AND CONCEPTS

The County reserves the right to adopt or use for its benefits, any concept, plan, or idea contained in any proposal.

22. BID/PROPOSAL DISCLOSURES

Results of bids for the purchase of goods, materials, general services and construction are considered public information at the time of the bid opening. All information contained in the bid response is available for public review.

The Proposal for Services: The names of those who submitted proposals will not be made public information until an award is made by Commissioners' Court and contract executed by the parties. No price, staffing or other proposal information will be released. Proposers are requested to withhold all inquiries regarding their proposal or other submissions until after an award is made. No communication is to be had with any County employee, other than the Purchasing Agent, regarding whether a proposal was received. Violations of this provision may result in the rejection of a proposal.

23. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL

Proposers may request withdrawal of a sealed proposal prior to the scheduled proposal opening time provided the request for withdrawal is submitted to the Purchasing Agent in writing. No proposals may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) calendar days after opening of the proposals.

24. INDEMNIFICATION

- A.** The contractor shall agree to assume all risks and responsibility for, and agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless, the County, its elected and appointed officials and department heads, and its agents and employees from and against all claims, demands, suits, actions, recoveries, judgments, and costs and expenses including reasonable attorney's fees for the defense thereof in connection therewith on account of the loss of life property or injury or damage to the person which shall arise from contractor's operations under this contract, its use of County facilities and/or equipment or from any other breach on the part of the contractor, its employees, agents or any person(s) in or about the County's facilities with the expressed or implied consent of the County. Contractor shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against El Paso County resulting from contractor's operations under this contract.

If Contractor fails to do so, then the County reserves the right to pay unpaid bills of which County has written notice direct and withhold from Contractor's unpaid compensations a sum of money reasonably sufficient to liquidate any and all such lawful claims.

29. MERGERS, ACQUISITIONS

The Proposer shall be required to notify the County of any potential for merger or acquisition of which there is knowledge at the time that a proposal is submitted.

If subsequent to the award of any contract resulting from this RFP the Proposer shall merge or be acquired by another firm, the following documents must be submitted to the County.

1. Corporate resolutions prepared by the awarded Proposer and the new entity ratifying acceptance of the original contract, terms, conditions and prices;
2. New Proposer's Federal Identification Number (FEIN); and

33. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Proposer expressly acknowledges that it is an independent contractor. Nothing in this agreement is intended nor shall be construed to create an agency relationship, an employer/employee relationship, a joint venture relationship, or any other relationship allowing County to exercise control or direction over the manner or method by which Proposer or its subcontractors perform in providing the requirements stated in the Request for Proposal.

34. MONITORING PERFORMANCE

The County shall have the unfettered right to monitor and audit the Proposer's work in every respect. In this regard, the Proposer shall provide its full cooperation and insure the cooperation of its employees, agents, assigns, and subcontractors. Further, the Proposer shall make available for inspection and/or copying when requested, original data, records, and accounts relating to the Proposer's work and performance under this contract. In the event any such material is not held by the Proposer in its original form, a true copy shall be provided.
