The Purchasing Department has received the following questions to the bid mentioned above:

1. Will El Paso County accept proposal for only the body worn camera and cloud storage portion of the proposal without the tasers?

**RESPONSE: As stated in the bid specifications:
Bidders may bid on one or more of the items requested in this bid. The County will select the company or companies that best meets the needs of the County as described in this bid.**

2. On line item 9 under Body Worn Cameras, does the 12 hour battery operation pertain to the housed battery alone or can it include a portable battery pack?

RESPONSE: The 12 hour battery operation pertains to the housed battery.

Regarding Data Usage:

3. Please provide the approximate number of hours of video anticipated per shift.

RESPONSE: Officers work 12 hour shifts but may have to work longer in emergency situations. The actual number of hours recorded per shift will vary but an average of 2 to 6 hours per shift will be necessary.

4. Please provide the expected/requested retention time of recorded data (storage).

RESPONSE: The department is requesting that the video designated as evidence be stored for a period of no less than five (5) years under the terms of a current contract. Once the agency and courts determine that the evidence is no longer necessary, the county will dispose of it according to law. Any evidence stored, must be accessible to our agency and the courts even after the contract expires, as described in the bid.
