Must attend all three days. Day 1 & 2: Basic Shotgun Certification (TCOLE 2055) Day 3: Less Lethal Impact Weapons Training (TCOLE 3345) Requirement: Must bring the shotguns from their respective duty assignments. The Academy will not provide the weapons. Prerequisite: Student must not be prohibited by state, federal law, or rule from attending training by the commission through suspension or revocation; must currently hold a Jailer's certification. <p>FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR COURSE: (40 hrs.) (TCOLE 2222) This course is required to obtain Firearms Instructor Proficiency Certification from TCOLE. The student will be required to shoot two courses of fire (pistol/shotgun) on the first day with a minimum of 90% (2 attempts). If the student is unable to achieve 90% then they will not be allowed to participate in the course at this time. A comprehensive examination must be given, it will be supplemented by a skills proficiency demonstration. The student will also be required to conduct a live fire range evaluated on a pass/fail basis. Prerequisite: Not prohibited by state or federal law or rule from attending training related to firearms or from possessing a firearm; never had a license or certificate issued by the commission suspended or revoked; AND currently hold an Instructor Proficiency Certification from TCOLE. The simulator immerses participants in a panoramic scene of incidents and with a simple click, the officer can escalate simulated confrontations prompting officers to deploy guns or O.C. spray. <p>PRACTICAL PISTOL ACCELERATOR: (8 hrs.) (TCOLE 2055) The student will obtain an overview of marksmanship fundamentals, drills, and tools to create a "Better Shooter". The student will obtain information on the foundation required to become more efficient behind a handgun. The student will be able to recognize errors in their own shooting, and correct errors. The student will also learn techniques to improve shooting with a minimal round count. The student will leave the firearms range with a plan for improvement. Requirement: Must bring duty handgun, duty belt, magazine carrier, body armor, eye/ear protection (instructors can issue these if needed), appropriate footwear (closed toe shoes/boots), means of hydration, and note taking material (small notebook and pen is recommended). ****Physical Fitness Requirement****

Some courses offered by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office Region VIII Training Academy will require a degree of physical fitness.

Minimum Level- This level will consist of walking, stepping, and very light cardiovascular exercise.

Medium Level- This level will consist of jogging; minimal levels of calisthenics (i.e. push-ups, sit-ups, side straddle hop); and/or beginning levels of hands on contact (i.e. PPCT and O.C.).

Maximum Level- This level will consist of running; sprinting; advanced calisthenics; and/or advanced levels of hands on contact (i.e. mobile field force, physical fitness exams).

Medium and maximum- These levels will require a blood pressure screening and students who do not pass will not be allowed to participate without a doctor's release on file.
